**Positive Noticing** 

We've introduced a practical strategy called Positive Noticing in Buzz. This idea was developed by Paul Dix, a teacher, leader and trainer with of experience in working with challenging behaviours.

"Positive Noticing is a simple, practical and highly effective strategy that can be used as an everyday relational strategy, any time, any place. The idea behind it is to catch learners doing the right thing and marking it with positive acknowledgement. This not only shows kindness but it teaches behaviour. You get more of the behaviour that you notice most." Paul Dix

# Commemorating Holocaust Memorial Day 2024: 'Fragility of Freedom'







#### **Focus on Reading and Literacy**

We are proud to announce that a new phonics, accredited programme is now available at Buzz Learning: Rocket Phonics (via Hodder Education). We continue to provide our learners, who benefit from its resources, with individual booklets to further practise letter recognition and formation; building sentences and apply punctuation rules, correctly. Half-termly assessments are undertaken to ensure learners are making good progress, alongside termly reading assessments. Reading interventions are taking place daily, with learners spending 10-15 minutes reading independently or with staff. Please, feel free to let Buzz Learning know if you would like your child to bring their reading book(s) home to practise reading even further. We can provide a paper-based reading log to record progress.







At Buzz Learning, we are very proud of our learners for their wonderful stories and designs, created to celebrate World Book Day as well as entering the 'Super' WoW competition, alongside other schools around the UK. Buzz learners have won the competition, and selected book prizes will be provided, to congratulate them for their hard work. Learners have clearly demonstrated that their creative skills have generated new ideas, bringing stories to life, via a range of dialogue, imagery and figures of speech. Well done!

The Orwell Youth Prize 2024 is coming to Buzz Learning! Learners have volunteered to prepare for the national entry this year, competing against many UK schools, from Year 7 to Yea 11. This year's theme, understandably, is the meaning of *Home*, asking young writers to consider what 'home' truly means to them. Learners are working towards submission deadline, and we wish them all 'the best of luck' in qualifying for the finals!

#### **Careers and Work Placement**

Our learners have had a busy term participating in careers events, activities and work experiences.

Our Supported Interns have been industriously developing their essential skills and impressing Buzz staff and placement supervisors with their burgeoning confidence. Due to their diligence and resilience, we expect that some of the interns will be offered employment.

### Mental Health and Wellbeing News

#### **MELVA** programme

We are delighted to let you know that Buzz is participating in the MELVA programme.

The MELVA programme is part of our whole school approach and commitment to cultivating mental health and wellbeing.

MELVA is a mental health education through storytelling intervention for Key Stage 2 (7-11years) and older young people in SEND settings. This award-winning creative, web-based programme is designed to improve children and young people's knowledge and understanding of mental health and wellbeing and is a fun, high impact way to deliver parts of the RSHE curriculum.

The MELVA programme focuses on early intervention for children and uses recognised and recommended mental health first aid strategies, communicated in a child-friendly and accessible way. MELVA is for all children, not just those who are struggling. It focuses on teaching children the basic skills and understanding they need to keep themselves well, whatever challenges they might face in the future, supporting the development of resilience pathways, positive emotional responses, and relationships.

#### **Youth Mental Health First Aid**

Well done to the Buzz staff team who recently completed their Youth Mental Health First Aid training. This is such a fantastic achievement which further demonstrates our whole school approach to supporting Mental Health and Wellbeing.

A big thank you to Amanda, from Cygnus Support who delivered our training and provided the support to enable us to have the whole staff team trained as Youth Mental First Aiders.

Amanda is the co-ordinator working with the parents and carers of children and young people attending the Trailblazer schools within Ashington, Bedlington, Blyth and Hexham, or who are home schooled. Amanda is also offering a range of support to parents and carers to help them manage their own emotional wellbeing and build their confidence and skills so that they feel more able to support their children's emotional health. The support can be through:

- one-to-one sessions, over the phone or in person, so that parents have space to talk
- peer groups for parents and carers to talk with others going through similar experiences
- workshops focusing on wellbeing in a positive and informative way Amanda is working with the
   Educational Mental Health Practitioner team and the Trailblazer schools to facilitate these
- practical tools and techniques to help build a useful personal toolkit
- signposting to other services for specialist help and support that may be needed.
